	o Forgiveness of sins - to wipe the slate clean - past
	o The gift of the Spirit - newness of life, radical transformation of the heart - present (and
	future - foretaste, pledge, etc.)
• The	gospel requires a radical response:
	o Repentance and faith ()
	o In baptism ()

The gospel in sum: 2 events (death & resurrection), attested by 2 witnesses (OT and NT), resulting in 2 gifts (forgiveness and the Holy Spirit), on 2 conditions (repentance and faith, in baptism)
