The Conversion of Cornelius - Introduction
Key conversions in Luke's narrative (Saul and Cornelius) Shift in v. 32?

3 $\qquad$ stories portray different forms of confrontation:

- 9:32-32 - Aeneas/Tabitha - confrontation with disease and death
- 10-11 - Cornelius - confrontation with Gentile alienation
- 12 - Herod - confrontation with political tyranny

Peter Heals Aeneas and Raises Tabitha - 9:32-43
Aeneas (Lydda) in v. 33 - Bedridden eight years, paralyzed

Tabitha (Joppa) in v. 36ff. - "a disciple...who was abounding with deeds of kindness and charity which she continually did,"

- V. 39 -made undergarments and outer clothing for the needy
- V. 37 - became sick and died


Purpose of these miracles: Portraying Peter as an authentic
$\qquad$ of Jesus Christ (2 Cor. 12:12; cf. Elijah/Elisha 1 Kings 17:17-24; 2 Kings
4:32-37)

- Followed the $\qquad$ of Jesus
- Aeneas: Acts 9:34b-35 and Mark 2
- Tabitha: Acts 9:40-42 and Mark 5
- Performed by the $\qquad$ of Jesus (vv. 34, 40)
- Were signs of the $\qquad$ of Jesus
- Verb in vv. 34, 40 ("Get up!") = verb used of God raising Jesus from the dead
- The recovery from paralysis and resuscitation = visible signs of Peter's apostolicity AND of the new life offered by the same power that raised Jesus from the dead!
- Led to the $\qquad$ of Jesus (vv. 35, 42)


## Peter is Sent for by Cornelius - 10:1-8

9:43 - in Joppa with a tanner?

## Cornelius

- Stationed in Caesarea (see map) - garrison city, administrative capital of province of Judea
- A centurion of the Italian cohort (regimen) - 600 men each
- 10:2 - "A devout man and one who feared God with all his household, and gave many alms to the Jewish people and prayed to God continually"
- V. 22 - respected by all the Jews, but had not become one.

Concerning the impassable gulf that separated Jews from the Gentiles

- Ephesians 2 double alienation and dividing wall
- Gentiles as "dogs" - No association (v. 28)
- Jews and the Samaritans (ch.8), now Jews and the Gentiles

Vv. 3-8 - Cornelius' vision
