

## **Corinth and Ephesus - Introduction**

- Urban areas
  - 1st journey: Salamis, Paphos (Cyprus); Antioch, Iconium, Lystra, Derbe (Galatia)
  - 2nd journey: evangelized Philippi, Thessalonica, Berea (Macedonia); Athens, Corinth (Achaia); Ephesus (Asia)
  - 3rd journey: Ephesus
- Athens, Corinth, and Ephesus =
  - \_\_\_\_ locations
  - Population: Athens (10,000), Corinth (750,000), Ephesus (500,000)
  - Location: Situated around the shores of the Aegean Sea
  - Influence:
    - Athens: \_\_\_\_\_ center of the ancient world
    - Corinth
      - Great \_\_\_\_\_ center, world-famous emporium
      - Political importance: Capital of Roman province of Achaia
      - Geographical: Commanded the major trade routes in every direction
      - Seafarers and maritime merchants  $\rightarrow$  Poseidon worship
    - Ephesus
      - Famed for its commerce  $\rightarrow$  Barclay: "the \_\_\_\_\_ of Asia Minor"
      - Political importance: Capital of Roman province of Asia
        - Primarily a \_\_\_\_\_\_ center of the Graeco-Roman world
          - Imperial cult worship
            - "The guardian of the temple of Artemis" = Diana (Rom.)
- Paul's common pattern: Evangelization of the Jews → Jewish opposition to the Gospel → Paul's deliberate turn to the Gentiles



# Paul in Corinth (v. 1)

- V. 1 "After these things he left Athens and went to Corinth." (cf. I Cor. 2:1-5)
  - Their \_\_\_\_\_ arrogance
    - Proud of their city (Julius Caesar in 46 BC) → wealth, culture, Isthmian Games political prestige
    - Cf. I Cor. 1:26ff.
  - Their \_
    - Acrocorinth, the temple of Aphrodite (Venus)
      - Sexual promiscuity of Corinth was proverbial
    - Cf. I Cor. 6:9-11
