

## **More About Ephesus**

- Luke narrating how Paul left Ephesus after the better part of 3 years and is making his way to Jerusalem (although we know his sights are set beyond there to Rome)
- Luke sees parallel between Paul's journey to Jerusalem and Jesus' (prominent in his gospel)
- Luke intends his readers to see Paul as following in his master's footsteps
- Acts 1:1 "In my first book I told you, Theophilus, about

everything Jesus began to do and teach..."

## Paul in Northern and Southern Greece (vv. 1-6)

- V. 1 heading for Macedonia through Troas
- V. 2a "he encouraged the believers in all the towns he passed through"
  - o Churches founded during 2nd missionary journey (Philippi, Thessalonica, Berea)
  - Παρακαλέσας (v. "parakalesis," vv. 1-2) to ask, beg, plead; to comfort, encourage, exhort, urge; to call, invite.
    - Literally: "
- V. 2b makes it to Greece (Hellas, popular name for Achaia most likely in Corinth)
  - Stayed 3 months (v. 3a)
    - Time to meet with leaders over doctrine and ethics
    - Finalized giving for Judean chuches (I Cor. 16:1-4; Acts 24:17)
    - Wrote his letter to the Romans (cf. Romans 15:17-33)

- V. 3b reversed direction due to the threat
- V. 4 traveling companions
  - Almost always traveled with someone, expressed desire for companionship when not (Athens - Acts 17:15-16; cf. I Thess. 3:1, 5 and Rome - II Tim. 4:9, 21)
    - Especially on his missionary journeys
  - Entourage bears a 3-fold witness

• Vv. 5-6 - everyone congregates at Troas, where they spend a week together

## A Week at Troas (vv. 7-12)

- The death and resuscitation of Eutychus
  - V. 7 "On the first day of the week" (first evidence of Sunday worship) "we gathered with the local believers to share in the Lord's Supper" (cf. Luke 22:20; 24:30-35; Acts 2:42)
  - Luke's first-hand, eyewitness details:
    - It was an evening service/meeting (v. 7)
    - It was held in the upstairs of a private home (v. 8), on the third floor (v. 9)
    - Many lamps were lit, so the atmosphere was probably stuffy and oily, leading Eutychus to sit on the window ledge (v. 9), presumably for some fresh air
    - While referred to a young man in v. 9 (νεανίας, "neanias"), in v. 12 he is called a boy (παῖς, "paheece"), normally covering the years from 8-14.
    - The boy "became very drowsy" and as Paul went on he "fell sound asleep" (v. 9)
    - Dropped 3 stories to his death (v. 9)
    - Paul (cf. Elijah, I Kings. 17:19ff.) embraces the boy who comes back to life (v. 10)

  Word and sacrament belong
- viola and saciament belong
  - Sacrament as a "visible word" (Augustine)
  - The church is built on the Word as it comes to us both audibly and visibly, in declaration and in drama
