

# Introductory points

- - Evangelistic sermons to either Jewish (2:14ff.; 3:12ff.; 13:16ff.) or Gentile audiences (10:34ff.; 14:14ff.; 17:22ff.), legal defenses before the Sanhedrin (4:8ff.; 5:29ff.; 7:1ff.) or the 5 speeches before Jewish or Roman authorities in chs. 22-26.
- Feels like reading an epistle resemblance of themes: Grace of God (vv. 24, 32), Kingdom of God (v. 25), Purpose of God (v. 27), Redeeming blood of Christ (v. 28), Repentance and faith (v. 21), Church of God and its edification (vv. 28, 32), Inevitability of suffering (vv. 23-24), Danger of false teachers (vv. 29-30), Need for vigilance (vv. 28, 31), Running the race (v. 24), Final inheritance (v. 32)
