## The Christian Life

"you did not learn Christ in this way" (v. 20)

- Sharpness in contrast
- 3 parallel expressions Christian moral education:
  - You "learned" Christ (v. 20)
    - Paul has "preached Christ" (II Cor. 4:5) they have "learned" (v. 20) or "received" Christ (Col. 2:6)
    - Christ is the \_\_\_\_\_ of the teaching apostolic tradition (cf. I John 1:1, 3)
  - You "heard" him (v. 21a)
    - Not "about" him no preposition
    - Christ is also the \_\_\_\_\_
    - His hands, feet, and \_\_\_\_\_
  - You were taught "in" him (v. 21b)
    - Christ is the <u>atmosphere</u> in which they have been taught ("in him" v. 21b)
    - He is the \_\_\_\_\_\_ for "futility of mind"

## What specifically had they already been taught about, by, and in Jesus?

- V. 22-24 Becoming a Christian involves a radical
  - o conversion (from human side) and re-creation (from divine side)
  - Repudiation of old "self" (fallen humanity) and assumption of new self (re-created humanity)

corrupt, degenerating, headed toward

Freshly created after the moral likeness of God

ruin/destruction

Passions Holiness

Lusts were "deceitful" Righteousness is "true"

- In addition must come a continuous inward renewal of our outlook "be renewed (present infinitive vs. aorist) in the spirit of your minds"
  - Heathen depravity is due to "futility of mind". Ongoing Christian holiness depends on "renewing" of our minds
    - Cf. Rom. 12:1-2; 1:28-31
- Clothing metaphor: We \_\_\_\_\_\_ to fit the \_\_\_\_\_\_
  - Children of God "wear" the new clothing of a holy, ethical lifestyle

<sup>&</sup>quot;Therefore" (v. 25) - implications! This is what your new clothes look like.
