 - V. 22b Obedient living is the indispensable ______, not the meritorious cause, of answered prayer
 - In context:
 - Prayer must be according to his _____ (5:14; cf. Ps. 37:4; John 15:7)
 - Prayer must be in Christ's _____ (John 16:23-24) and for God's (Jas. 4:2-3)
 - Prayer must come from a cleansed (Ps. 66:18; Prov. 15:29; Isa. 59:1-2; Jas. 5:16), forgiven, and forgiving (Mark 11:25)

Summary

- No one can claim to live in Christ and Christ in him unless obedient to 3 fundamental commands: Belief in Christ, moral righteousness, and love for brothers
- Life in Christ ≠ mystical experience alone. It indispensably includes the confession of Jesus Christ as the Son of God and a life of holiness and love.
- We know we are real Christians when the Spirit's voice is subjectively witnessed in our hearts and fruits objectively manifest in our lives
- Our hearts can be at rest before God and enjoy mutual abiding communion
